

Statement REACH, RoHS, Dodd-Frank-Act, Packaging law

1st Regulation (EC) No 1907/2006 (REACH)

The company Carl Stahl Hebetchnik GmbH acts according to the EU regulation 1907/2006 (REACH-VO) of 18 December.

2006 as a post-connected user and supplier of articles, from which no substances are released as intended for an additional function. According to our suppliers, the materials used by us do not contain any substances from the candidate list (SVHC list) in a concentration of more than 0.1% by mass.

2nd EU Directive RoHS (2015/863)

The European Union Directive 2015/863 on the restriction and use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment (RoHS) became effective on 31 March 2015. These substances are as follows:

0.1 % by weight per homogeneous material:

- (a) lead,
- (b) mercury,
- (c) hexavalent chromium,
- (d) polybrominated biphenyl (PBB),
- (e) polybrominated diphenyl ethers (PBDE);
- (f) di(2-ethylhexyl)phthalate (DEHP),
- (g) butylbenzyl phthalate (BBP); (h) dibutyl phthalate (DBP),
- (i) diisobutyl phthalate (DIBP),
- (j) Cadmium 0.01 % by weight per homogeneous material.

3rd Conflict minerals - Dodd-Frank Act - Regulation (EU) 2017/821

On 15 July 2010, the US Congress ratified the Wall Street Reform Act, which also contains a regulation on conflict minerals. The law is aimed at companies that use **tantalum, tin, tungsten or gold** in their products or in the production of their products and requires these companies to file an annual report with the US Securities and Exchange Commission disclosing whether these minerals originate in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) or its neighboring states. In Europe, Regulation (EU) 2017/821 has been effective since May 17, 2017, establishing due diligence obligations for Union importers of tin, tantalum, tungsten, their ores and gold from conflict and high risk areas.

In order to meet the requirements of our customers, we have actively asked our relevant suppliers to provide us with information about the origin of the materials we use in conflict and high-risk areas.

We currently have no indication that any of our products from our Carl Stahl-Direct catalogue and the industrial safety/fall protection catalogue "so-called conflict minerals" could be included.

4nd Packaging law

Carl Stahl Hebetchnik GmbH operates in accordance with the Packaging Act which became effective on 1 January 2019. If necessary, sales packaging, shipping packaging, service packaging and outer packaging are reported.
